

Tabrecta™ (capmatinib) (Oral)

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I. Length of Authorization

Coverage will be provided for six months and may be renewed.

II. Dosing Limits

A. Quantity Limit (max daily dose) [NDC Unit]:

- Tabrecta 150 mg tablets: 4 per day
- Tabrecta 200 mg tablets: 4 per day

B. Max Units (per dose and over time) [HCPCS Unit]:

- 800 mg per day

III. Initial Approval Criteria

Coverage is provided in the following conditions:

- Patient is at least 18 years old; **AND**

Universal Criteria ¹⁻³

- Must be used as a single agent; **AND**
- Patient does not have symptomatic CNS metastases; **AND**
- Patient will avoid coadministration with strong CYP3A inducers (e.g., rifampin, carbamazepine, St. John's Wort, etc.); **AND**
- Therapy will not be used concomitantly with other tyrosine-protein kinase mesenchymal-epithelial transition [cMET] or Hepatocyte Growth Factor Receptor [HGFR] -inhibitors (i.e., crizotinib); **AND**
- Patient has not previously failed treatment with cMET or HGF -inhibitors (e.g., crizotinib, etc.); **AND**

Non-Small Cell Lung Cancer (NSCLC) ¹⁻³ † Φ

- Patient has metastatic disease; **AND**
- Patient's disease has a mutation that leads to mesenchymal-epithelial transition (MET) exon 14 skipping as detected by an FDA-approved or CLIA compliant test❖; **AND**
- Patient's disease is epidermal growth factor receptor (EGFR) wild-type; **AND**

- Patient’s disease is anaplastic lymphoma kinase (ALK)-rearrangement negative; **AND**
- Patient has at least one measurable lesion

IV. Renewal Criteria ¹

Authorizations can be renewed based on the following criteria:

- Patient continues to meet the universal and indication specific criteria as identified in section III; **AND**
- Disease response with treatment as defined by stabilization of disease or decrease in size of tumor or tumor spread; **AND**
- Absence of unacceptable toxicity from the drug. Examples of unacceptable toxicity include the following: interstitial lung disease (ILD), pneumonitis, severe hepatotoxicity, severe photosensitivity, etc.

V. Dosage/Administration

Indication	Dose
NSCLC	Administer 400 mg orally twice daily with or without food, until disease progression or unacceptable toxicity.
