

## Sylvant™ (siltuximab) (Intravenous)

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### I. Length of Authorization

Coverage will be provided for six months and may be renewed.

### II. Dosing Limits

#### Quantity Limit (max daily dose) [NDC Unit]:

- Sylvant 100 mg single-use vial: 3 vials per 21 day supply
- Sylvant 400 mg single-use vial: 3 vials per 21 day supply

#### Max Units (per dose and over time) [HCPCS Unit]:

- 130 billable units every 21 days

### III. Initial Approval Criteria <sup>1</sup>

Coverage is provided in the following conditions:

- Patient is at least 18 years of age; **AND**

#### Universal Criteria <sup>1</sup>

- Patient is human immunodeficiency virus (HIV) negative; **AND**
- Patient is human herpes virus-8 (HHV-8) negative; **AND**
- Patient is currently free of all clinically significant active infections; **AND**
- Patient will NOT receive any live vaccines during treatment with siltuximab; **AND**
- Must be used as a single agent; **AND**

#### Multicentric Castleman's Disease (MCD) † Φ <sup>1-4</sup>

#### Unicentric Castleman's Disease (UCD) ‡ <sup>2</sup>

- Must be used second-line therapy for relapsed or refractory disease; **AND**
- Patient has plasmacytic/mixed histology

† FDA Approved Indication(s); ‡ Compendia Recommended Indication(s); Φ Orphan Drug

#### IV. Renewal Criteria <sup>1,2</sup>

Coverage can be renewed based upon the following criteria:

- Patient continues to meet universal and other indication-specific relevant criteria such as concomitant therapy requirements (not including prerequisite therapy), performance status, etc. identified in section III ; **AND**
- Disease response with treatment as defined by stabilization of disease or decrease in size of tumor or tumor spread; **AND**
- Absence of unacceptable toxicity from the drug. Examples of unacceptable toxicity include: gastrointestinal perforation, severe infusion related reactions and severe hypersensitivity, etc.

#### V. Dosage/Administration <sup>1,3,4</sup>

| Indication      | Dose  |
|-----------------|---|
| All indications | Administer 11 mg/kg intravenously every 21 days until treatment failure |
